Charges to make use of the internet are as follows: € 1.00 for 20 minutes, € 2.00 for 60 minutes, € 3.00 for 100 minutes, € 5.00 for 180 minutes, € 10.00 for 400 minute, and € 20.00 for 900 minutes.

Malta Fireworks Festival – 30 April to 01 May 2009



The Grand Harbour will once again provide the perfect setting for the 8th edition of this festival. The event commences with a 15-minute fireworks display, designed by a foreign pyrotechnic company, followed by fireworks displays put up by local factories in a 'one by one' series. In each category there is a trophy as well as prize money to be won. Everyone is invited to attend and enjoy the show free of charge. The best locations for viewing the displays are Lascaris Wharf or the top of the bastions that surround Malta's capital, which have commanding views over the Grand Harbour. The festival also serves to commemorate Malta's accession into the European Union on 1st May 2004.

The Azure Window - Gozo



The Azure Window is another spectacular natural landmark in Dwejra, along with The Inland Sea and Fungus Rock. The Azure Window at the end of the cliff, is a giant doorway, through which one can admire the blue expanse beyond the cliff. It must be one of the most photographed vistas of the Islands, and is particularly spectacular during the winter, when waves crash high inside the arch. The sea around is very deep and of a dark blue hue, which explains why it is called the Azure Window.
