St. Paul's Catacombs - Rabat



St. Paul's Catacombs have been named after St Paul because of their vicinity to St Paul's Church and Grotto. In 1894, they were cleared up and investigated by Dr A. A. Caruana, the pioneer of Christian archaeology in Malta. The catacombs are a fascinating labyrinth of 3rd century AD subterranean tombs and the earliest archaeological evidence of Christianity in Malta. They incorporate tombs for more than 1,000 bodies in 2,200 square meters. Not the entire site is accessible to the public, however there is enough to provide a fascinating glance at a number of different types of tombs.
